

## Transporting your cat to the vets

### The carrier

- Ensure it is sturdy, non-collapsible, well ventilated and secure. Cardboard boxes are not suitable.
- Ideally chose a carrier that can be opened from the top, to make it much easier to get your cat in and out of the carrier
- Line the carrier with newspaper to absorb urine and a towel or bed they're familiar with
- Partially cover the carrier with a towel or cloth to help your cat feel more secure, but still ensure adequate ventilation.
- Familiarise your cat with the carrier beforehand by leaving it open in the home with the front door open to encourage them to investigate

When you arrive at the practice you will be asked to wait in our designated cat waiting area. You can borrow a blanket to cover the basket and we suggest you use our stands to put your cat up high.
